General classification

Chickens are a part of the bird family. Most birds can fly and have feathers. They have two legs and two wings and can lay eggs.

Habitat/where found

Chickens are found all around the world. They also live in farms and backyards and some are at the zoo. There are some that are wild chickens in India and Southeast Asia.

Description

Chicken's have two legs and two wings covered with feathers they have two eyes they can come in black,white,brown,blue,green,red,silver,gold they have sharp nails and they are about 20-30 cm tall and roosters have a wattle and comb.

Food

They eat seeds, fruit, grass, bread, snails, worms and vegetables.

Life Cycle

They mate then she lays heaps of eggs and sits on them for 3 weeks (21 days). Then chicks hatch out and they grow into a young chicken then a chicken grows into a hen or rooster

Predators of poultry

The predators of chickens are; foxes, cats, dogs, dingos, snakes, and humans.
