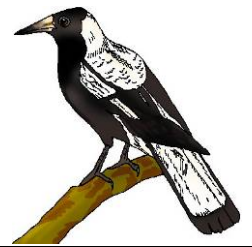

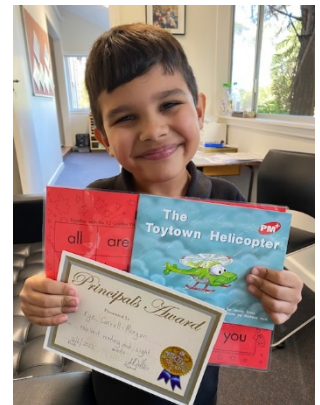
doing activities with any children/siblings in the library if needed. We have sent home a letter of interview times and if you can't make it, please ring and we can reschedule another day.
