COVID-19 Guidelines – Update

We continue to operate under the guidance of NSW Health and the NSW Department of Education's COVID-19 guidelines. Full details can be found at https://education.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/advice-forfamilies In summary:

- Mask-wearing is encouraged indoors
- Staff and students cannot attend school if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19. If symptoms occur at any time, your child should not attend school and should undertake a rapid antigen test (RAT).
- Rapid antigen testing (RAT) is encouraged for students and staff who have COVID-19 symptoms or are identified as close contacts.
- Additional supplies of RATs will be sent home with your child unless you advise us that you do not wish to receive them.
- Students who are close contacts must not attend school if they have symptoms. If your child is a close contact and attending school you must notify the school. Students should also conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result for 5 school days.
- We will be maximising natural ventilation.
- Regular hand washing is encouraged

We are looking forward to the term ahead. If you are having any trouble with getting your child to school/uniform/food etc. please contact me anytime.
